- the Judaizers were basically teaching that in order to become a <u>Christian</u>, one must first become a Jew
- the Jewish Law was written on <u>tablets</u> while the Christian law was written in people's <u>hearts</u>
 *Paul had lived on both sides of this and knew the difference

(The main difference for Paul is the fact that he didn't know God on one side- Acts 9:5)

vs.17- Paul has just given testimony of his conversion (vs.15-16) and now begins to talk about his calling afterwards

(This tells us what happened during the "many days were fulfilled" in Acts 9:23)

- after Paul was saved, he goes on, led by hand to Damascus where he starts proclaiming Christ
 - he then goes to <u>Arabia</u>- this is a wilderness desert that stretched eastward from Damascus down to the Sinai Peninsula
- *instead of going straight to Jerusalem to be instructed by the apostles, Paul goes off by himself and gets instructed by the <u>Lord</u>
- Paul's ministry would be different in the fact that he would be the apostle to the Gentiles
 - after his time in Arabia, Paul returns to Damascus and learns of a plot to kill him by the Jews (This is where he is let down a wall by basket in order to elude capture)
- vs.18- "three years" this is the total time from conversion until his return to Jerusalem
- -"up"- you'll notice in your Bible that this is the term always used when traveling to Jerusalem (Its always "going down" when leaving Jerusalem)
- -"see"- (historeo) its where the word "history" is derived
 - the word means to gain knowledge of or to learn by inquiry
 - he went to inquire knowledge of Christ through someone who knew Him while He was here
- <u>vs.19- James-</u> this was Christ's half-brother, considered the pastor at the church in Jerusalem, and the writer of the Book of James (James the disciple was a different man)

Truth- this James was not even saved until after the Resurrection- John 7:5, I Cor. 15:4-7

vs.20- his enemies had apparently accused him of being good with words - a liar

-"before God"- this is a solemn declaration on his integrity and him being truthful

(The only reason Paul would state this is the fact that they were accusing him of lying)

vs.21- Syria- the region where Damascus and Antioch were located

*the church at Antioch would be the place that Paul would be sent and return from his trips (This is the church where they were first called Christians- Acts 11:26)

-<u>Cilicia</u>- Tarsus was the capital here and the home of Paul (<u>aka</u>- Saul of Tarsus)
(Paul would stay here and preach for approx. 5-6 years)

vs.22- he was unknown to them simply because he had only visited Jerusalem briefly (He hadn't formed any other acquaintances with any of the churches in Judea)

*Judea was the area immediately outside of Jerusalem

- -"in Christ" he states this to show them that there was no indifference between he and these churches
- <u>vs.23</u>- even though they had never seen Paul, they had heard about what God had done in him and what God was doing through him
- "now preacheth" present tense- this means that they continued to hear about God's mission and His use of Paul
- vs.24- "glorified" (doxazo) to praise, magnify, and honor
- *when a church is "<u>in Christ</u>" and hears of how God is working and how lives are being changed, the people in it will always rejoice and glorify God
